Next Residential Retreat

The next Mid America Dharma Group retreat is scheduled to begin on Thursday evening, February 15th and close on Monday February 19th (President's Day) after lunch at Conception Abbey. Our teacher will be Gil Fronsdal who is joining us for his third MADG Retreat. Gil is a very popular teacher with our Sangha so you are encouraged to register early to assure your attendance. Non-Residential Format to Continue in 1996

The non-residential retreat format continues to be a popular format with 45 persons attending the recent Wes Nisker Retreat in October. We hope to have several additional non-residential retreats in 1996. Currently we have a non-residential scheduled for April with Mary Orr and hope to have Wes Nisker back in the Fall. Additional retreats will be offered in Kansas City as we are able to arrange them with available teachers.

MADG's Structural Changes

To track and manage our finances better, MADG is making some accounting changes. So far, operating expenses (such as payment for this newsletter) have come from money left over after our retreat expenses were paid. We have never charged membership fees.

Starting January 1st, three accounts will be opened. In addition to the current General Operating Fund, a separate Scholarship Fund will be established as well as a Reserve Account (for money to be saved for future needs). This will allow people to make donations either to the General Operating or Scholarship Fund. Donations are of course always greatly appreciated. When we complete our incorporation as a non-profit in 1996, these donations will be tax deductible.

Along with procedural changes, there have been some staff changes. After long and faithful service, Karen Cassell has turned over the Treasurer's duties to John Van Keppel. David Saas has been consulting with John to establish a new and more detailed accounting system. By spring, we hope to be able to provide on-demand PC generated financial statements.

The group is a forum for experienced students to share their practice and experience the support of other dedicated Sangha members. The meetings took place once a month on Saturday mornings. The sessions began and ended with a 20 minute sitting - often members would go to lunch after the end of the meeting. There was strong support for continuing the program with three new sessions scheduled for 1996.
