# Policy Change on Retreat Fees Adopted

The Steering Committee has adopted a new fee payment policy for MADG retreats. We have reviewed the payment policies of several meditation groups who regularly conduct retreats and almost all of them require full prepayment rather than deposit/on site payment as we currently do.

A prepayment policy will assure that the group does not pay for unused rooms or meals at the retreat facility and will greatly expedite the check in process on the first night of the retreat. This policy will also allow for better assessment of potential scholarship funds for a given retreat.

This policy should not adversely impact anyone's ability to attend a retreat if funds are not readily available to them by the deadline date as we do offer a deferred payment program to anyone who has submitted the required deposit for a residential retreat. Your understanding and cooperation in the implementation of this new procedure is greatly appreciated.

# Kalyana-Mitta (Noble Friend) Discussion Group Added


